1. WHAT IS A COOKIE?

A 'cookie' is a small data file that is placed on your computer or mobile device ("device"). It allows a website to remember your actions or preferences until the cookie is deleted or expires. Some of the cookies used on the Site are essential for the Site to work. Some non-essential cookies are also used on the Site to collect information to help improve the Site.

Cookies can be stored for varying lengths of time on your browser or device. Session cookies are generally deleted from your computer or device when you close your browser. Persistent cookies will remain stored on your computer or device until deleted or until they reach their expiry date as detailed in the tables below.

2. TYPES OF COOKIES USED

The types of cookies used on the Site are set out below, as well as their purpose, duration and whether the cookie is placed by the Operator or a third party. Some cookies are referred to as first party cookies meaning they are set by the Site's domain. Third party cookies are set by a domain other than the Site. Third party cookies are covered by the policies of those third parties.
